Viel gruessen!

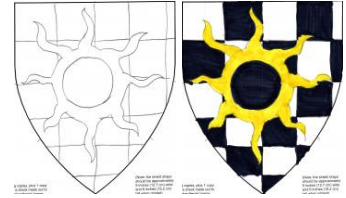

I request your input on the following submissions:

### 1: Agamemnon Platolithidae - New Name & New Device

*Checky argent and sable, a sun Or eclipsed sable.*

Submitter desires a masculine name.



Agamemnon - [LGPN] Listed as "Ἀγαμέμνων" Two instances of the given name in Volume 3a, two instances in Volume 5a, per the database search: <http://www.lgpn.ox.ac.uk/database/lgpn.php>

Platolithidae - Per LGPN (<http://www.lgpn.ox.ac.uk/names/practices.html>), this is used as an epithet meaning "flat stone" or "rock". Plato, originally Ἀγαμέμνων from "platus" meaning 'flat' (Liddell & Scott - <http://www.perseus.tufts.edu/hopper/text?doc=Perseus:text:1999.04.0057:entry=i%29soplath/s&highlight=platus>). Lithidae derived from "lithos" meaning 'stone' especially those used by warriors. (Liddell & Scott - <http://www.perseus.tufts.edu/hopper/text?doc=Perseus:text:1999.04.0057:entry=li%2Fqos>)

### 2: Alexander Brightmoore - New Release of Name & New Release of Device

*Per pale azure and argent, in fess four chalices counterchanged*

I, <modern name>, formerly known in the Society for Creative Anachronism, Incorporated (SCA) as Alexander Brightmoore release the following name and armory registered to me in the SCA:

Alexander Brightmoore, name registered in April 2013 (via Calontir).

"Per pale azure and argent, in fess four chalices counterchanged," armory registered in April 2013 (via Calontir).

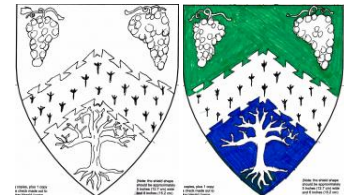
### 3: Bechte von Holtzburg - New Name & New Device

*Per chevron vert and azure, two grape clusters and a tree blasted and eradicated and on a chevron dovetailed argent semy of cloves sable*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

Sound most important.

von - preposition meaning "of" or "from"

Holtzburg - [Brechenmacher] p. 734 s.n. Holtzburg(er) has Holtzburger dated to 1363.

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### 4: Charles von Strausberg - New Name Change

OSCAR NOTE: the old name was registered in October of 1995, via Atenveldt.  
Old Item: *Charles von Strasburg*, to be released.  
Submitter desires a masculine name.

Charles - already registered to client

Strausberg - [Brechenmacher] s.n. Straßburger; dated to 1342 Pieter Straißburger, 1343 Cuonz der Stausßburger.

This is a name change because the client is not happy with the spelling of his currently registered name.

He would prefer the spelling "Strausberg" rather than "Strausburg."

### 5: Eynon Langenyth - New Name Change From Holding Name

Old Item: *Eynon of Grimfells*, to be released.  
Submitter desires a masculine name.

Eynon - already registered to client via the holding name

Langenyth - s.n. Llangennith, Llangynydd. Requested spelling dated to 1300. Found in *Dictionary of the Place-Names of Wales*. Copy found at <http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/docs/owenmorgan-llangennith.jpg>.

### 6: Johannes Gast - New Name

Submitter desires a masculine name.  
Meaning (Johann the Guest) most important.

Johannes - frequency of 397 between the years 1451-1500. Found in "Late Period Masculine Given Names" by Talan Gwynek. url: <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/germmasc.html>.

Gast - [Brechenmacher] s.n. Gast; example dated 1171 Gerardus Gast

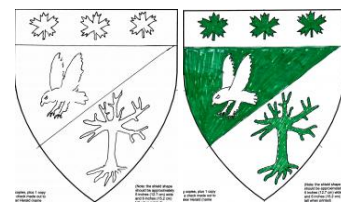
### 7: Karina Gründelhardt - New Name & New Device

*Per bend sinister vert and argent, a striking falcon argent and a tree eradicated and blasted vert, and on a chief argent three maple leaves vert.*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

Karina - modern name allowance; driver's license submitted

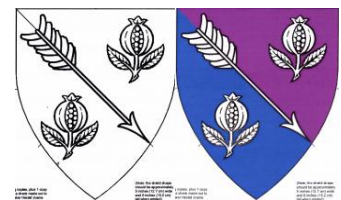
Gründelhardt - [Brechenmacher] s.n. Gründelhardt; dated to 1474 Andr. Gründelhardt



### 8: Lelia Corsini - New Name & New Device

*Per bend purple and azure, an arrow bendwise between two pomegranates slipped and leaved argent.*

Submitter desires a feminine name.  
No major changes.  
Sound (Closest to Lelia or Laylia or Layli/Leyli) most important.



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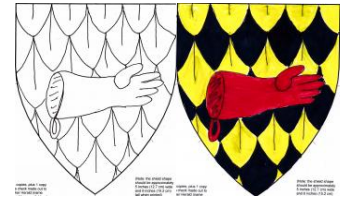

### 9: Lisette la fauconniere d'Amboise - New Name & New Device

*Plumity Or and sable, a falconer's glove gules.*

Submitter desires a feminine name.  
No major changes.  
Client requests authenticity for 1295 France.  
Language most important.  
Culture most important.  
Meaning most important.

### 10: Lucia Flecher - New Name & New Device

*Purple, a firebird and three crescents each with a mullet between the points Or.*  
Submitter desires a feminine name.  
No major changes.  
Sound (Loo-see-ah) most important.

Flecher - [R & W] s.n. Fletcher; William Flecher dated 1203

### 11: Luckie Glasbrenner - New Name Change

OSCAR NOTE: the old name was registered in December of 2008, via Calontir.

Old Item: *Luckie of Falcon's Keep*, to be retained as an alternate name.  
Submitter desires a masculine name.

Luckie - already registered to client

Glasbrenner - [Brechenmacher] s.n. Glaser, Gläser, p. 563

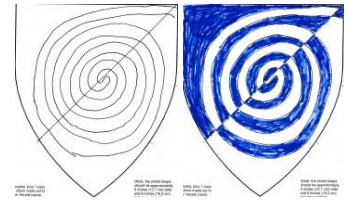
Note: The client is wishing to change her surname to mean "glass worker" in German.

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**12: Maggie MacKellar** - New Name & New Device

*Per bend sinister azure and argent, a gurge counterchanged.*

Submitter has no desire as to gender.  
Language (Manx or Scottish) most important.  
Culture (Manx or Scottish) most important.

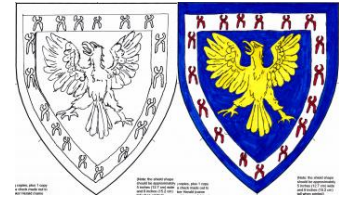
**13: Rab the Piper** - New Name & New Device

the Piper - [R & W] s.n. Piper; William le pipere 1202

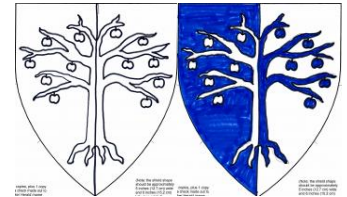


**14: Rolant de Bourbonne** - New Name & New Device

*Per pale azure and argent, an apple tree blasted counterchanged.*

de - preposition meaning "of"

*Argent, a torii gate gules and on a chief wavy sable three cherry blossoms argent*

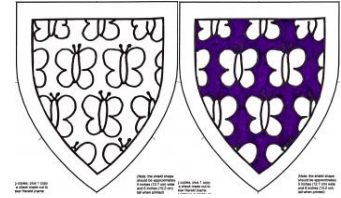

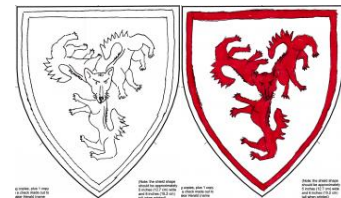
**17: Ulfvaldr Folkmarsson** - New Name & New Device

Submitter desires a masculine name.

-valdr - s.n. -valdr p. 106 in *Nordiskt Runnamnslexicon*



Folkmar - s.n. Folkmar p. 126 in *Nordiskt Runnamnslexicon*, and [GB] p. 17 gives the construction to form the patronymic "Folkmarsson"
