1: Hadassah filla de Solomó - Resub Device

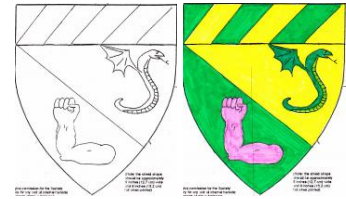
OSCAR finds the name on the Calontir LoI of June 29, 2013 as submitted.

Per bend Or and vert, a python contourny vert and an arm embowed bendwise sinister proper, a chief bendy sinister vert and Or.

The previous submission was returned for a redraw because the per bend division line was placed incorrectly.

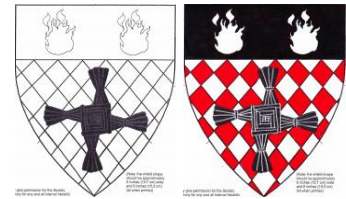


We believe this new submission fixes this error.

2: Mór Bhallach inghean Domhnaill - New Device Change

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in February of 2009, via Calontir

Lozengy argent and gules, a cross of St. Brigid and on a chief sable two flames argent



Old Item: *Argent, in pale three crosses of Saint Brigid sable, a dexter tierce indented gules.*, to be retained as a badge.

The use of a cross of Saint Brigid is a step from period practice. Therefore, this device is still registerable.

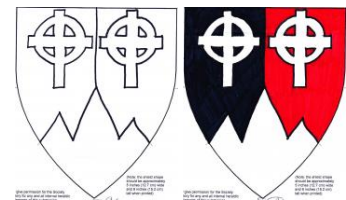
3: Rafe le Mountere - New Device

OSCAR finds the name on the Calontir LoI of September 28, 2013 as submitted.

Per pale sable and gules, two Celtic crosses and a mountain of three peaks argent.

This was a resubmission at Kingdom level due to a redraw.

Submitted on the ILOI as *Per pale sable and gules, two Celtic crosses and a mountain argent*, it was changed slightly at Kingdom to reflect commentary.

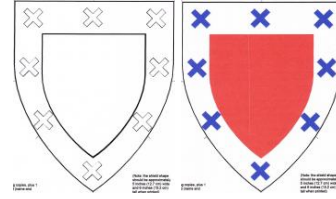

4: Ximena Echeberria - Resub Name & New Device

Gules, a bordure argent semy of saltorels azure.

Submitter desires a feminine name.
No major changes.
Language most important.

Client previously submitted the surname "Etxeberria":

Pended April 2013 - "Ximena Etxeberria. Name.

The submitter did not date the submitted spelling of the byname Etxeberria, though other spellings of the byname are dated. As the byname was misspelled (as Etxeberria) for most of the commentary period, we are pending this in order to allow commenters to determine if this modern spelling can be found in period.

We note that the source the submitter provided for documentation seems to use modernized and standardized Castilian forms, not period documentary forms. Thus, they are evidence that some form of that name is period, not that any particular spelling is period."

And Returned September 2013 - "Ximena Etxeberria. Name.

The spelling Etxeberria is a modern Basque spelling of a place name normally spelled Echeberria in Castilian contexts. The spelling Echeberria is dated to before 1600; commenters could find no evidence that Etxeberria was found as a spelling before the mid-20th century spelling reform of Basque. Barring evidence that this is a period spelling, this name cannot be registered as submitted. We would change the byname to Echeberria in order to register the name, but the submitter allows no changes. Thus, this name must be returned."

Submitter requests: "I want the ends of the arms of the tiny Xs in the border cut at right angles to the arms themselves, exactly as they appear in the emblazon. Please match the blazon to the emblazon."

The previous submission, *Gules, a bordure argent a semy of saltorelles gules* was returned at Kingdom in December 2012 due to a conflict with Glafridus de Gaugie (12/06 via Atlantia): *Gules, a bordure argent a crusilly Maltese gules*. We believe that this resubmission addresses these issues.

Returnd for further work:

1: Sawbina Fahy - Resub Device

Unfortunately, the device *Purpure, semi of butterflies displayed argent* conflicts with Adelheid Silberschmidt (2004 via Atlantia) *Azure, semy of butterflies argent*. There's only one difference between the two devices by changing the field color.

Adding a bordure or chief should take care of the conflict.
