

1: Luckie of Falcon's Keep - New Device

OSCAR thinks the name is registered as *Luckie of Falcon's Keep* in December of 2008, via Calontir.

Quarterly argent and azure, a four-leaf clover slipped vert between in bend sinister two compass stars argent.



It was noted that compass stars are a step from period practice.

2: Zachariah Lochrie - New Name

Submitter desires a masculine name. No major changes. Sound most important.

Sibéal inghean Dáire - New Name

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

Sibéal - Found in "Irish Names and Surnames" by Patrick Woulf p. 216 and in OCM p. 165

inghean - patronymic "daughter of"

Dáire - Listed with a count of 28 at "100 Most Popular Men's Names in Early Medieval Ireland" by Tangwystyl verch Morgant Glasvryn at http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/tangwystyl/irish100/

Wolfe's book doesn't give any dates for the given names listed, so it shouldn't be used as source for documenting first names. Commentors couldn't find any dated examples of Sibéal within our time span. Isibél and Sibil could be found, however, in acceptable sources in the 15th and 16th centuries Dáire was listed in the given citation as pre-1200, but won't work with a given name more than 300 years later.
