Forwarded to Laurel:

1: Agnes von Heidelberg - Resub Device

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in June of 2011, via Calontir $\,$

Per chevron throughout azure and argent, two garbs Or and a lamb dormant azure



This was returned at Laurel on the June 2011 LoAR:

"This device is returned because commenters were unable to identify the charge in base as a lamb or sheep. This is a violation of section VII.7.a of the Rules for Submissions, which requires that "Elements must be recognizable solely from their appearance."

Additionally, the device is returned for violating section VIII.4.c of the Rules for Submissions, "Natural Depiction", which requires that charges be depicted in their heraldic forms and postures. The lamb is not in a recognizable heraldic posture, having all four limbs extending diagonally forward from the body. Animals in a 'dormant' posture have their limbs folded under them, not extending from the body."



2: Alexandra Vazquez de Granada - Resub Badge

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in July of 2006, via Calontir $\,$

(Fieldless), a pomegranate slipped and leaved per pale argent and azure, seeded counterchanged



This is a resubmission at the Kingdom level. Her previous submissions were returned in March 2012 for conflict, since the seeding is large enough to be blazoned but not more than half of the design to count for a CD.

1) '(Fieldless) A pomegranate slipped and leaved azure seeded argent' had only 1 CD with: (Fieldless) A pomegranate azure slipped and leaved vert [Registered March 2005].

2) '(Fieldless) A pomegranate slipped and leaved argent seeded azure' had only 1 CD with: Per bend sinister rompu argent and gules, n sinister base a pomegranate sliped and leaved argent, seeded gules.

We believe that this design fixes these conflicts.

3: Alexandra Vazquez de Granada - New Heraldic Will

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in July of 2006, via Calontir



The blazon was submitted as a copse of three pine trees but was changed after internal commentary.

8: Iulia Kaloethina Eirenikina - New Name & New Device

Argent, a bend sinister azure between an oak leaf vert and a wolf sejant ululant sable

Submitter desires a feminine name. Spelling most important.

Feminine Names

Women's names were constructed similarly [to masculine names]. Women would carry their father's last name as their own, and might also carry family names from either their father's or mother's genealogy as middle names. All of these family names would be feminized. When a woman married, she would take her

husband's last name, either replacing or appending it to her own. She might also add names from her husband's genealogy.

A typical woman's name during this period would look like:



15: Persephone Odymsy - Resub Device

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in February of 2013, via Calontir





Her previous armory submission was returned on the April 2013 LoAR:

"Persephone Odymsy. Device. Argent, a wood bow bendwise, string to base, nocked of an all brown arrow proper, on a chief indented vert a pomegranate and a mug, each bendwise sinister, Or.

This device is returned for redraw, for violating SENA A2C2 which states "Elements must be drawn to be identifiable." The chief here is drawn so low as to be confused with a per fess division. As a field divided per fess and a field with a chief are quite different, we must be able to distinguish between them.

The pomegranate here is also not reliably identifiable: it is cut in half to show all of the seeds, not just a narrow strip of seeds as in the heraldic pomegranate, is drawn at an angle instead of upright, and is depicted with perspective. This is also a violation of SENA A2C1, which states "Animals and plants must be drawn in a stylized heraldic form, not in a naturalistic or photorealistic style...While depictions that are somewhat more naturalistic than the flat stylized depictions of heraldic charges will be registered, animals and plants may not be drawn in trian aspect (with perspective)..."

The all brown arrow proper is also not allowable. SENA A3B1, when discussing proper tinctures, states "tools that can reasonably be wooden can be described as a wooden X proper, and are brown." While an arrow shaft may certainly be wooden, and the fletchings could conceivably come from a brown bird, the arrowhead is not naturally brown. The submitter may wish to consider an entirely sable bow and arrow upon resubmission."

This resubmission is a completely new design.

16: Shane Bax - New Name & New Device

Argent, a hawk striking contourny vert maintaining an arrow bendwise sinister between three crosses of Calatrava sable Submitter desires a masculine name. Sound most important.



Shane - Late period English surname may be used as a given name per precedent noted on the April 2010 LoAR. Shane is found in the IGI Parish Records with several listings dated to period and the grey period, including 1564, 1600, 1612, and 1644:




19: Wiglaf Birkibeinn - New Name & New Device

Returned for more work:

1: Cuthbert Longschankes - New Device

Unfortunately, this must be returned due to its similarities to already registered devices. It conflicts with Geoffrey of Kirkwood (reg. 12/1990 via the West), "Azure, an owl within a bordure embattled Or." There's only 1 heraldic difference for the type of peripheral charge. It also conflicts with Samuel Milde (reg. 7/2008 via Atenveldt): "Azure, an owl perched upon and sustaining a ball-peen hammer fesswise Or." There's only 1 heraldic difference for the type of secondary.

2: Kýlan gyldir - New Name Change From Holding Name

This submission needs to be reworked before being submitted to Laurel. The name needs to be "Kylan gyldir" or "Kýlan gylðir" (either both names need their accent marks, or both have none). Since <u>no changes</u> were marked, the submitter will need to let Saker know which is their choice so it can proceed.

3: Luther der kampfer des blitzes von Basele – New Badge

This needs to be returned because fieldless badges with charged rondels cannot be registered.

4: Sveinn Njallsson - New Name Change

This submission is returned because the previously registered name, Svein Njalsson is formed correctly. The genitive of <Njall> is <Njals> not <Njalls>. If the client can find documentation otherwise, please let Saker know so it can be forwarded with the submission to Laurel. Otherwise. <Njallsson> is not registerable.

5: Wulf filius Werner - New Name

This submission needs to be reworked before being submitted to Laurel. The name cannot be registered as a mix of vernacular first name with a Latin surname; a choice of language needs to be made. If the client wishes for a Latin name, *Wulf filius Werneri* should be submitted., which was similar to the <u>Wulf vilius Wolberti</u> that was in their documentation. If the client wises for a vernacular (Germanic) name, *Wulf Werner* or *Wulf Wernerso(h)n* should be submitted.
